**The District** – The Southwestern Medical District in Dallas includes a unique blend of medical providers, researchers, and scholars who deliver exemplary health care and innovative, world-class research and education. The District, with more than 1,000 acres, is located just northwest of downtown between Interstate 35E and the Dallas North Tollway and includes vast medical-related facilities – UT Southwestern Medical Center, William P. Clements Jr. University Hospital, Parkland Memorial Hospital, and Children’s Medical Center Dallas, among others – as well as research, higher education, and clinical institutions. The District employs more than 38,500 people, and its health care professionals treat nearly 2.5 million patients annually. Parkland, Children’s Health, and UT Southwestern are interconnected through UT Southwestern faculty who teach medical students and serve patients within the primary District institutions.

UT Southwestern, one of the premier academic medical centers in the nation, integrates pioneering biomedical research with exceptional clinical care and education. The institution’s faculty comprises many distinguished members and has received six Nobel Prizes since 1985. The full-time faculty of more than 2,900 is responsible for groundbreaking medical advances and is committed to translating science-driven research quickly to new clinical treatments.

UT Southwestern’s William P. Clements Jr. University Hospital opened in December 2014, transforming medical care in North Texas. Only six years later, to meet a greater-than-expected need for specialty patient care in the region and surrounding states, UT Southwestern added a \$520 million expansion to the facility. As a hospital within an academic medical center, Clements University Hospital is the centerpiece for carrying out UT Southwestern’s three-part mission – to heal, innovate, and educate.

UT Southwestern physicians provide medical care in more than 80 specialties to more than 100,000 hospitalized patients and nearly 360,000 emergency room cases, overseeing approximately 4 million outpatient visits a year.



Parkland first opened its doors in 1894 and is now one of the largest public hospital systems in the country. The hospital averages more than 1 million outpatient visits annually. Services include a level 1 Trauma Center, the only verified burn center in North Texas, and a level 4 Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. The system also includes 14 community-based clinics, including primary care and women’s clinics, 5 school-based clinics, and numerous outreach and education programs. Parkland is the primary teaching hospital for UT Southwestern Medical School. As the public hospital for Dallas County, Parkland ensures that care is available to all county residents and leads in community-based health care and outreach.



For more than 100 years, the mission of Children’s Health and its flagship hospital, Children’s Medical Center Dallas, has been to make life better for children. Since it began in 1913 as a baby camp, the institution has had a long-standing commitment to the community that includes not only high-quality patient care but also advocacy, education, and preventive care. Children’s Health is one of the largest and most prestigious pediatric health care providers in the country and is the leading pediatric health system in North Texas. Through an academic affiliation with UT Southwestern, Children’s Health is a leader in life-changing treatments, innovative technology, and groundbreaking research. The health system is consistently recognized among the top children’s hospitals in the country by U.S. News & World Report. Since 1996, Children’s Health has published Beyond ABC, an in-depth look at the quality of life for children in North Texas, and serves as a leading voice for the health of our community’s youngest residents.
